# A Word of Thanksgiving

A missionary tells the story of their work in a remote village and among a people with an unfamiliar language. One of the real frustrations for the missionaries in teaching the truths of the Bible was that there was no word in their language for the concept of "thanksgiving." So, it became even more challenging to convey the truth of God's Word as it relates to thankfulness and responding to God's goodness.

In our English language we say "thanks"; in the German language we say "Danke"; in the Spanish language we say "Gracias." Most languages have a word for that concept.

Think for a moment how strange it would be if we had no word to express the concept and emotion of thanksgiving. We can be thankful that our language has such a word for thankfulness. However, even if we have the word with those familiar syllables that we speak and receive on a regular basis, would there be any difference from the primitive tribe if we didn't have the spirit of thankfulness in our hearts?

Indeed, the month of November reminds us that we need to learn and practice thanksgiving in our day to day lives and among our family and friends. Holy Scripture impresses this upon us with the familiar gospel reading of the healing of the ten lepers, and the one person out of ten who returned to the Lord Jesus to give thanks for the healing. The apostle Paul could write to the Philippians and to us, "...in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

Thanksgiving as a national holiday should impress upon us the lively spirit and response by former generations of Americans who recognized and celebrated God's hand and plan in their destiny, whether it be immigrants coming to America in hope of a brighter future, or whether it be families who fought and sacrificed for freedom in a hostile

world, or whether it be parents striving to support their families.

Jo and I are reflecting on the one-year anniversary of the formal Call to be your pastor here at SOTL. We are thankful to God and to you for receiving us in the gracious way that you have, and for your care for us as we strive to care for you in the name of our Lord and Savior.

A word of thanks for your thoughtful gift and expression of thankfulness to us in this month of October, pastor appreciation month. Thank you!

**STUDY OF LUTHER:** We have begun a new Bible Study Series on Sunday mornings and wish to invite everyone to come.

In A Man Named Martin - Part 1: The Man viewers encounter a 15th-century religious reformer from Germany who broke ranks with the Catholic Church. This Bible study is the first of a three-part series devoted to Martin Luther -- a monk whose Spirit-inspired grasp of God's justification of sinners through faith in the Savior was the cornerstone of the Protestant Reformation.

A Man Named Martin-Part 2: The Moment examines the errant teachings and wayward traditions of the Late Medieval Church that eventually sparked the Protestant Reformation, a theological overhaul set in motion most notably by Martin Luther's nailing of the 95 Theses to the church door at Wittenberg.

A Man Named Martin - Part 3: The Movement will show how the Reformation accelerated the transformation of a world already in flux. While armed conflicts, theological disputes, and heated controversies marked segments of society throughout medieval Europe, the march of the Reformation left its imprint on the face of culture and citizen alike. Everything from education, politics, science, theology, marriage, and the family-and even extending to one's view of vocation and his relationship to God-came under the shaping and seminal influence of the Reformation.



UPDATE ON SUE'S CONDITION: On October 10<sup>th</sup> I had my surgery and was home by 3:00p.m. that same day. My sister, Berd, stayed with us from Monday evening to Saturday morning. On Thursday, October 19<sup>th</sup> I went back for my post-surgical check-up and everything is healing just fine. The surgeon told us that my cancer was a Stage 1 Cancer, but that all the tissue around the area and in the lymph-nodes attached to the cancer area came back as cancer free, so we caught the cancer early. On October 25<sup>th</sup> I will be going in to talk to an Oncologist about my next step. They said it will take about 4 to 6 weeks for my body to completely heal.



# **CUSTARD PIE WITHOUT CRUST From the kitchen of:** *Jan Sorell*

6 Tbsp. Sugar 6 Tbsp. Flour Pinch of Salt 3 c. Milk 6 beaten Eggs Nutmeg

Blend sugar, flour, and salt. Add milk and stir in eggs. Pour in well buttered 9" (inch) pie pan. Sprinkle nutmeg on top. Bake at 325° for 40 minutes or until set (a knife inserted in the middle comes out clean). There will be a delicate crust on the bottom.

#### Pack a shoebox

- 1. You will find shoe boxes in the Fellowship Hall; just pick up what you need.
- 2. Determine whether your gift will be for a boy or girl, and the child's age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Mark the correct age category on the label (found here), and tape the label to the top of your box.
- 3. Fill the box with a variety of gifts that will bring delight to a child. Use the gift ideas provided on the bottom of this page.
- 4. Please donate \$9 or more for each shoe box you prepare to help cover shipping and other project costs. You can write a check to Samaritan's Purse (note "OCC" on memo line) and place it in an envelope on top of the gift items inside your box. If you or your family are preparing more than one she box, please make one combined donation.
- 5. Place a rubber band around each closed shoe box and drop off in the basket under the cross in the Fellowship Hall. We will be collecting the shoe boxes until November 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **GIFT IDEAS:**

- 1. <u>Toys:</u> small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yo's, jump ropes, small Etch-A-Sketch, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), slinky, etc.
- 2. **School Supplies:** pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.
- 3. **Hygiene Items:** toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.
- 4. Other: Hard candy and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries).
- 5. **A Personal Note:** In a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. (If you include your name and address, the child may write back.)

<u>Do Not Include:</u> Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow-globes or glass containers; aerosol cans. No toothpaste or candy, as these items are no longer allowed in shoeboxes due to customs regulations.
