**PROJECT 24:** These gifts go toward the three orphanage rescue centers promised through the District Conventions of the Minnesota North and North Dakota Districts. Minnesota North members should write their checks to the "Minnesota North District" and designate the funds for "Project 24." Each of the Districts will forward these gifts on to the Synod Office of International Missions (World Relief and Human Care). Each of the three rescue centers is approximately \$65,000.

The Convention Resolution encourages congregations of the Minnesota North District to hold a "Project 24 Sunday" each year for the next three years in order to raise the necessary funds to build 1 1/2 rescue centers. The goal is \$100,000 to accomplish this. As a demonstration of Witness, Mercy and Life Together, the North Dakota and Minnesota North Districts will partner together to build three rescue centers (orphanages): one by North Dakota (Witness); one by Minnesota North (Mercy); and, one together (Life Together).

When LWR distributes Personal Care Kits, it's often to people who have lost everything. In the wake of an earthquake, or having fled from violence as their homes were overtaken, they clasp a towel from a faraway place, with a bar of soap, a tooth-brush...and washing up, they know that they have not been forsaken by the world. The very simple gesture of giving a Personal Care Kit can give someone the encouragement to start anew, starting with a bath. You can share God's grace and love by providing that simple comfort. Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.

#### What to Include

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags. Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- ×1 One light-weight bath-size towel (between 20"×40" & 52"×27"), dark color recommended
- ×2 Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- ×1 One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging\*
- ×1 One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ×1 One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. \*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

You will find a basket by the wooden cross in the Fellowship Hall. We will collect from Ash Wednesday thru Palm Sunday.





SALAD kitchen of:

Marion Holmes

1 medium head of Cabbage Carrots
Onion Green Pepper

Mix in bowl; top with 7/8 cup Sugar.

Bring to boil:

1 c. Vinegar 1 tsp. Salt

3/4 c. Salad Oil 1 tsp. Dry Mustard 2 tsp. Sugar 1 tsp. Celery Salt

Pour over cabbage. Let stand 4 to 6 hours.



## **CABBAGE HOT DIST From the kitchen of:** *Unknown*

1 1/4 lb. Hamburger

¼ c. Brown Sugar, packed

1 large Onion, chopped

1 tbsp. Paprika

1 sm. to med. head of cabbage (about 6 or 7 c. coarsely shredded)

Salt, Pepper, and Garlic Salt to taste

1 can (15 oz.) Tomato Sauce

3 tbsp. Vinegar

1/4 tsp. Celery Seed (optional)

Brown hamburger and onion, add remaining ingredients and simmer slowly about one hour in large skillet. This is delicious served with hot rolls.



## **BAKED BEEF AND CABBAGE CASSEROLE From the kitchen of:** *Unknown*

1 lb. Hamburger Pepper to taste
1 med. Onion, chopped 1 sm. Cabbage, shredded
Oil for frying (about 5 ½ to 6 cups)
½ c. uncooked rice 1 c. tomatoes, juice or soup
1 tsp. Salt 2 c. Water & Beef Bouillon Cube

Shred cabbage coarsely. Spread half in buttered casserole. Heat oil in fry pan, add beef, onion, rice, salt and pepper. Cook and stir together but do not brown, about 10 minutes. Spoon mixture over cabbage. Top with remaining cabbage. Heat tomatoes with water and bouillon cube to boiling and pour over all. Cover and bake at 350° for 1 hour or until cabbage is tender.
