Jesus Is Risen

April, 2015

Dear members of Shepherd of the Lake,

"Christ is arisen and we shall arise: Give God the glory, Alleluia!"

That's the refrain from the hymn, "Alleluia! Jesus is Risen" (LSB 474), and it captures the message of Easter simply and beautifully. Jesus, the Son of God, was surrounded by sin and death in His life. He took on all of it and He died, rejected by the world and forsaken by His Father. But God raised Him on the third day. Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed, Alleluia!

We are surrounded by sin and death, too. What does it mean for us to believe that Jesus is risen? It means believing that just as He was raised, we will be raised (Romans 6:4–5). It means believing in "the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come" as we confess in the Nicene Creed. It means believing in the "the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting" as we confess in the Apostles' Creed. It means having hope today in the midst of sin and death because of the death and resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ, and the promise of our resurrection in Him (1 Corinthians 15:20–26).

"Christ is arisen and we shall arise: Give God the glory, Alleluia!"

That hymn concludes with the following two verses:

Weeping, be gone; Sorrow, be silent: Death put asunder, and Easter is bright. Cherubim sing: "O grave, be open!" Clothe us in wonder, adorn us in light.

City of God, Easter forever, Golden Jerusalem, Jesus the Lamb, River of life, Saints and archangels, Sing with creation to God the I AM!

May God send His Spirit to us again this Easter season that we might continue to believe in Christ crucified, share His message of hope with this world, and rejoice in Easter forever.



CINNAMON CHIP SCONES From the kitchen of: Bea Tabat

3 c. All-purpose Flour
1/3 c. Sugar
2 ½ tsp. Baking Powder
¾ tsp. Salt
½ tsp. Baking Soda
2/3 c. Butter or Margarine

1 tsp. Vanilla 1 c. Sour Milk 1 c. Cinnamon Chips 1 Tbsp. Milk 2 Tbsp. Sugar ¼ tsp. Ground Cinnamon

In a bowl, combine flour, sugar, baking powder, salt, and baking soda; cut in butter. Stir in sour milk and vanilla until combined. Fold in cinnamon chips. Turn onto a floured surface; divide dough in half. Shape each portion into a ball and pat into an 8 to 9 inch circle. Place on a lightly greased baking sheet. Brush with milk. Combine 2 tablespoons of sugar with cinnamon; sprinkle over scones. Bake at 350° for 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown.

EASTER STORY COOKIES From the kitchen of: In Memory of Carole Aeshliman

To be made the Saturday evening before Easter

1 c. Whole Pecans	Wooden Spoon
3 Egg Whites	Ziplock Baggie
1 c. Sugar	Waxed Paper
1 tsp. Vinegar	Cookie Sheet
Pinch of Salt	Таре

Preheat the oven at 300° (do this at the very beginning... do not wait). Place pecans in the baggie and let the children beat them with the spoon. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, the Roman soldiers beat him.

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put 1 tsp. vinegar in the bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross, he was given vinegar to drink.

Add egg whites to the vinegar. Egg whites represents life. Explain that Jesus gave his life for us.

Sprinkle a little salt in each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears that were shed by Jesus' followers and the bitterness of our own sins.

So far, the ingredients are not appetizing. Add 1 cup of sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of this story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to him.

Beat with mixer on high for 12 to 15 minutes or until stiff peaks form. Explain the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus.

Fold in the nuts. Drop the cookies by teaspoons full onto a wax paper covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus was laid.

Put the cookie sheet in the oven; close the door and turn the oven off. Give each child a piece of tape and tape the oven door shut. Explain that Jesus was sealed in the tomb.

Go to bed. Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven, but that Jesus followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed and they had to leave Jesus in there.

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies will be hallow; on the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb empty.


