Ascended and Descending

Dear baptized Christians,

On Thursday, May 14, 2015, we will celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord with a special Divine Service at 6:00 p.m. For, forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven. Luke describes it this way, "And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven" (Acts 1:9–11).

Jesus ascended as victorious and risen Lord and now reigns over all creation with all things under His feet (Ephesians 1:22). He is the King of the universe. One day, He will return in glory to judge both the living and the dead, giving everlasting life in paradise to all who believe in Him.

These are wonderful truths, but they can be confusing. Jesus' ascension might leave us wondering where to find Him today. It may leave us feeling alone and abandoned by Him. It may cause us to look for Him in all the wrong places. We may even begin to doubt that Jesus, hidden from our eyes, is actually reigning as Lord at all.

That is why we need to celebrate Ascension and hear the message that our ascended Lord promises to descend to us, not only on the Last Day, but daily through His Word. He descends to make Himself available to us. Listen to what Martin Luther wrote about this: "God has given us Baptism, the Sacrament of the Altar, and absolution to bring Christ very close to us, so that we can have Him not only in our heart but also on our tongue, so that we can feel Him, grasp Him, and touch Him." In other words, we do not need to search for God or find Him now that He is ascended and reigning over everything. He finds us. He descends and comes to us. Luther went on, "[God] wants to come to you, plant Himself before your very eyes, press Himself into your hands, and say 'Just listen to Me and take hold of Me, give Me eye and ear; there you have Baptism and the Sacrament of the Altar" (*Luther's Works* Vol. 22, pp. 421-422).

So, come and receive the ascended Lord Jesus Christ who descends to us in that Sacrament of the Altar on Ascension Day, Thursday, May 14, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. and every time He makes Himself available to us. Come to where He promises to be present for you. Come receive assurance that Jesus has not abandoned you, that He does forgive you, that He is King, that He is reigning over this world, that He is preparing a place for you in His Father's house, and that He will descend one last time when He returns on the Last Day to take you to be where He is (John 14:1–3).

RED POTATO SALAD

2.5 lbs. Red Potatoes 2 Scallions

2 ribs Celery 1 Green Bell Pepper

1 medium Red Onion

Dressing:

½ c. Mayo 1 Tbsp. Salt

2 Tbsp. Sour Cream Freshly ground Black Pepper

1 Tbsp. Dijon Mustard

Cook potatoes until tender; let cool. Cut celery at an angle in 1/8 inch slices. Cut onion and bell pepper into thin slices. Cut green part of scallions into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces (discard white part).



APPLE COFFEE CAKE

From the kitchen of: unknown

½ c. Butter½ tsp. Salt2 c. Flour2 Eggs, beaten1 c. Sugar½ c. Milk

3 tsp. Baking Powder 1 can Apple Pie Filling

Mix butter, flour, sugar, baking powder and salt as for pie crust, reserve ½ cup for topping. Mix eggs and milk together and add to first mixture. Spread in 9X13 inch pan. Top with pie filling, sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. Sprinkle remaining crumbs on for topping. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes or until golden brown.



MEATBALLS

From the kitchen of: *Unknown*

3 slices Bread (1 day old) 1 c. Milk

2 Eggs, slightly beaten
½ lbs. Ground Beef
½ lb. Ground Pork Shoulder
2 Ibsp. minced Onions

1 Tbsp. Salt 1 tsp. Sugar ½ tsp. Pepper 4 Tbsp. Butter

Remove crust from bread. Soak bread in milk. Add slightly beaten eggs. Pour this mixture into meat and work with hands until well blended. Add onions, salt, pepper, and ground meat. Mix thoroughly. Shape into round balls about size of a walnut. Melt butter in a skillet and add meatballs and cook until browned. Cover skillet and allow to steam over low heat 20 to 25 minutes.

Gravy may be made by adding 2 Tbsp. flour to drippings in pan and thin to desired thickness with milk.
