#### An Opportunity for Ministry

Dear members and friends of Shepherd of the Lake,

Ministry is the work of God among us. Our Heavenly Father enters our lives through the Means of Grace, Word and Sacrament, by the power of His Holy Spirit to deliver to us the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. These things ought never to be assumed or taken for granted. It is a miracle of His grace that we have received His work among us in faith. It is also a miracle that, by that same grace, He has invited us to participate in that ministry not only by receiving it, but also by sharing it with one another and with all others. That is, after all, the mission: *Share the Gospel*.

Back in 2012, guided by the mission to *Share the Gospel*, our Strategic Planning Committee asked any number of questions about the ways God has blessed us and the ways we might use those blessings to His glory and the benefit of our neighbors in support of the ministry of this congregation. That planning process began the renovations we have seen and now enjoy, in connection with our 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in May of 2014. Thank you so much to all those who participated in that endeavor! That planning process also began conversations about ministry to Native Americans. We are still in prayer about identifying a Native American man who might minister to that community. Finally, that planning process initiated a partnership with Good Shepherd Community in hopes of exploring the possibility of an assisted living facility on our property.

This is an important month with respect to that third point. After an initial informational meeting following worship on <u>July 26</u>, we will have a follow-up meeting after worship on <u>August 2</u>. Then, after worship on <u>August 16</u>, we will gather to vote on this project. Please plan to participate in this process.

I would like to frame our conversations and decision this month with two thoughts. First, this is the Lord's church. He has graciously called us to faith and gathered us together as His congregation. So, we must do everything we can to support and promote the ministry of Word and Sacrament, God's Means of Grace, already taking place at Shepherd of the Lake. As above, to Share the Gospel is vital and cannot be taken for granted. Second, the Lord of the church is giving us an opportunity for ministry. Whether or not we, as a congregation, decide to move forward in our partnership with Good Shepherd toward a facility on our property, whether or not we, as a congregation, conclude that this is the best thing to do with our current resources, this is an opportunity from God for ministry. How amazing that we have the privilege of participating in God's work among us!

As we discuss and decide this opportunity this month, there is absolute freedom. There is no compulsion. There is no right or wrong answer. There is only Jesus Christ crucified for sinners and their salvation along with the opportunities to *Share the Gospel* in any and every way we can. So, may the Lord Jesus be with us, bless us, and give us His peace as we participate in His work in this world.





#### **LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS:**

We are planning to gather school kits this fall for Lutheran World Relief. The plan is to begin the ingathering on August 2, 2015 and end it on September 6. The Evangelism Committee will purchase the back packs.

Education is important for every community, especially where poverty or disaster has limited the options for young people to reach their potential. School kits contain essential supplies to help children—and in some cases adults—continue learning despite the hardships they face. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

#### School Kits Items:

Four 70 sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper; no loose-leaf paper

One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.

One pencil sharpener

One pair blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band

One box of 16 or 24 crayons

One 2 ½" eraser

Please do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

#### **WONDERFUL CHICKEN/PASTA SALAD From the kitchen of:** *Dorothy Mickelson*

Cook 4 or 5 chicken breasts (simmer in water to cover, add 1 cup diced onion and  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. garlic salt to water). Drain when tender; cut into small bite size pieces. Sprinkle salt and pepper. Set aside.

Use fresh vegetables:

2c. Broccoli 1 Cucumber, sliced thin 2 c. Cauliflower 1 Green Pepper,

chopped

2 c. Celery Black Olives, optional

1 c. Carrots, sliced very thin (may parboil) Cherry Tomatoes, sliced or grape tomatoes ½ c. Frozen Peas (can use more if desired) 12 oz. Rotini Pasta, cooked, drained

6 Green Onions (use some of the greens for color)

#### Dressing:

½ c. Mayo (Do not use Miracle Whip)

½ c. Sour Cream (Do not use light)

½ c. Italian Dressing (Wishbone is good)

½ tsp. Italian Seasoning (dry)

Place all veggies in a bowl. Add pasta; pour dressing over. Toss well. Fold in cut up chicken. Let set several hours before serving. If more moisture is needed, add Hellmann's Garlic Ranch as needed. Sprinkle with Salad Supreme to taste.



## PICNIC POTATO SALAD From the kitchen of: Unknown 6 c. Potatoes, cubed 1/4

tsp. Pepper 34 c. Salad I

34 c. Salad Dressing hard-boiled Eggs 14 c. French Dressing

sliced Radishes

1 tsp. prepared Mustard ½ tsp. Salt ¼ c. minced Onions

1 c. diced Celery ¼ c. chopped Pickles

Blend salad dressing, French dressing, mustard, salt and pepper in a large bowl. Add cool potatoes, eggs, radishes, celery, sweet pickles, and onions. Toss lightly. Chill. Makes 3 quarts
