Listening to Jesus

Dear disciples of our Lord Jesus,

Jesus gathered His disciples by calling them to follow Him and listen to Him. How amazing that Jesus has called each one of us to follow Him and listen to Him, too. How awesome, also, that even as He commands us to listen to Him, He promises to accomplish His purpose in us when we do (Isaiah 55.10-11).

At Shepherd of the Lake, there are weekly opportunities to hear the voice of Jesus, our Savior, at worship and Bible study. We are looking to make some changes to this schedule, though. We discontinued our Sunday evening study at the end of September due to lack of participation. Also, beginning in Advent, our Wednesday morning studies will be moved to Thursdays at the same time: 8:00 and 9:30am. Sunday morning will remain the same.

For quite some time, we have attempted to offer a midweek service or study during the evenings at our church, in order accommodate those who are unable to join us on either Sunday morning or midweek mornings. Few have taken advantage of these opportunities, but I am certainly glad that some have! I hope to continue to offer something in the evenings but I would like to have a better understanding of the needs and desires of the congregation. If you would, please consider the following two questions:

- 1. Would you enjoy an evening service and, if so, what day of the week?
- 2. Would you enjoy and evening study and, if so, what day of the week?

If you would like to share your answers to these questions or any thoughts you have on the services and studies we offer, you are more than welcome to stop in, call, or email me. I would love to hear from you! Thank you!

I pray the Lord continues to bless us as we hear His Word and follow Him, now and forever.



NUTTY CRACKER DELIGHTS From the kitchen of: *Judy Stahl*

42 Club Crackers 1 tsp. Vanilla

½ c. Sugar 1 c. slivered Almonds

½ c. Margarine or Butter

Place crackers in single layer in foil lined pan, 15X10X1 inch. In saucepan over medium heat, melt butter; add sugar. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Boil 1 to 2 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove from pan immediately; cool. Store in airtight container in refrigerator.



PECAN PIE BARS From the kitchen of: Jan Sorell

Crust:

3 c. Flour

½ tsp. Salt

½ c. Sugar

1c. (2 sticks) Margarine or Butter

Beat flour, butter, sugar, and salt until it resembles crumbs. Heavily grease bottom and sides of 15X10 inch baking pan at least 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch deep. (I have used a 9X12 inch and an 8X8 inch). Press mixture firmly into pan and bake at 350° for 20 to 25 minutes.

Filling:

4 Eggs, slightly beaten 3 Tbsp. Butter, melted 1 ½ c. Light Corn Syrup (or dark) 1 ½ tsp. Vanilla 1 ½ c. Sugar 2 ½ c. chopped Pecans

Blend eggs, corn syrup, sugar, butter, and vanilla. Stir in chopped pecans. Spread over hot crust. Bake at 350° for 25 minutes or until set. Cool; cut into bars. Make 50 bars.


